Notes from the Chair

***For those who wish to go to the inspections site at Fort Rucker you MUST have your current vehicle registration papers and proof of auto insurance. They will stop you at the gate to check these and give you a visitor's pass to enter post.

Inspections participants:

Please be sure that you have all the necessary paperwork in to Marynell. This includes all of the following:

1 the completed nomination form for each pony being presented with inspections fees

- **2** a copy of your pony's registration certificate,
- **2** a current copy of your pony's Coggins report
- **2** a front and side photo of your pony

Be sure to bring with you on inspections day:

I the completed, signed veterinarian form , including a measurement, performed by the vet and signed in the right upper corner of the form.

(If you do this within the month before you come to inspection, you won't have a separate vet call for the health cert to travel between states.)

Ithe original Coggins form, (necessary for travel)

I the pony's original registration certificate. Approved ponies have a seal affixed to their certificate after inspection.

I To enter Fort Rucker you MUST have your current vehicle and trailer registration forms as well as proof of auto insurance.

For those who will be stabling their ponies overnight at Fort Rucker please e-mail Kelly <u>darkhorsestation@centurytel.net</u> for more information on the facility requirements and what is available. I will need your tentative arrival time and date to give a heads up to the Equestrian Center.





In February we went to Pine Top Farm. We had Monte and Dan entered at Training, but had to scratch Monte due to an infected puncture which was healing, but he had too much time off and wasn't ready. So, in went Art. I had not been planning to move him up to Training yet, but figured I would give it a go and at a minimum make it a combined test, knowing they run dressage and Stadium on Saturday.

The weather was spectacular - paybacks from Poplar. Art and Dan once again scored the same - 27.9 - in front of two different judges, placing them first in Training Horse and Junior Training respectively. I walked the XC, and although a challenging one for move-up, I decided to run Art. I did not push for time, and he put in a gallant effort but 8.4 time faults dropped him to 3rd. Once conditioned, he should be able to make the time easily. Devon and Dan had a fantastic run, finishing clean and well within the time, to hold their first place.

This was our last recognized show until March, as Devon accomplished her goal of making the Milton HS Varsity Soccer Team. She practices every day after school and has games every Friday. Fortunately for her, she has mom who loves to ride her horse and keep him in shape for when she has time to show!
